J. I. Case Tractors 1969-1984

In 1967, Tenneco Inc. acquired Kern County Land Company and its controlling interest in the J. I. Case Company. Tenneco kept increasing its ownership of J. I. Case until it owned all of the company by 1970. While this was taking place, Case introduced the 70 series of tractors for 1970 at its Intro 70 dealer meetings in August 1969. The four row-crop models were the 770 at 53 PTO horsepower, the 870 at 70, the 970 at 85, and the 1070 at 107. These tractors featured a new design of diesel engine, an optional 12-speed partial powershift transmission, an isolated operator's platform, and a cab with a built-in ROPS. The flambeau red paint was replaced with a slightly different power red color. The 1170 with a turbocharged diesel engine producing 122 PTO horsepower was soon added. Dealer demonstrator tractors with black hoods were known as Black Knights. The 430 and 530 received new 470 and 570 model numbers. The four-wheel-drive 1470 with a 504-cubic-inch turbocharged diesel engine replaced the 1200 in 1969.

During 1970, J. I. Case began to discontinue the manufacturing of farm implements and announced the Rockford, Illinois, factory would be closed. This was followed in 1972 by the decision to drop the Case combines and to concentrate on building tractors. Then Case purchased the David Brown Company of England, which added the 885, 990, 995, and 1210 models of utility tractors. The Case 470 and 570 models of tractors were discontinued.

Additional models of higher horsepower tractors were introduced in early 1972. The 1175 replaced the 1170, but with no increase in power. The turbocharged 1270 was introduced at 126 PTO horsepower, but increased to 135 in 1974. The turbocharged 1370 started at 142 PTO horsepower, but the rating soon became 150. The four-wheel drive 2470, with Case-built major components and 174 PTO horsepower, replaced the 1470 for the 1973 model year. Case discontinued the 770 in 1973 and the 870 in 1974 in order to produce more of the larger models in a tractor factory working at capacity. In 1974, Case replaced the desert sunset color with the David Brown white and all the Case tractors were painted "power white/power red."

For the 1975 model year, Case added the 1410, an 80 PTO horsepower utility tractor, and the 2670, a second model of four-wheel-drive tractor. The 2670 was rated at 219 PTO horsepower with its turbocharged and intercooled 504-cubic-inch diesel engine. The 1570, a row-crop tractor rated at 180 PTO horsepower, was introduced for the 1976 model year. Some of these were sold in 1976 as a Spirit of '76 tractor with stars and stripes decals. A third four-wheel-drive model, the 2870, was added for the 1977 model year. It was rated at 300 engine horsepower with a 674-cubic-inch Scania 6-cylinder diesel engine.

Four row-crop models replaced six for the 1979 model year with the introduction of the 2090, 2290, 2390, and 2590 tractors with PTO horsepower which continued to range from 108 to 180. All four models were powered by the 504-cubic-inch diesel engine, with the largest three being turbocharged. Other changes included cab improvements and a new style of hood and grill. The three four-wheel-drive models with a new cab became the 4490, 4690, and 4890 for the 1980 model year. Five new utility tractors, the 1190, 1290, 1390, 1490, and 1690 ranging from 43 to 90 PTO horsepower, were added for the 1981 model year.

The power red color was replaced with black in 1983 and the entire line was updated to become the 94 series for the 1984 model year. A fourth four-wheel-drive model, the 4994 with a 400 horsepower turbocharged Scania V-8 diesel engine, was also added.

On November 24, 1984, Tenneco announced it was buying selected assets of the agricultural equipment division of International Harvester and combining them with the J. I. Case Company. As a result, the 1985 tractors were labeled Case International and painted IH red. This started a series of mergers and buyouts and today there are only three major farm equipment companies remaining.

Under 21 Club members participating in the show this year will display special cards on their exhibits with the **Under 21 Club** logo. **Under 21 Club** participants will also have a special section in the parade following the feature tractors on Friday and Saturday. **Under 21 Club** members with equipment displayed during the show will be eligible for prizes – a special drawing will be held at noon on Sunday. (Do not need to be present to win but display must be registered)

Look for the special **Under 21 Club** logo on display cards as you walk the grounds and welcome the young people helping us preserve agricultural history. Be sure to ask them about their display, you will find most are very eager to "fill you in" on their exhibit.

Anyone wanting to join the **Under 21 Club** and participate with an exhibit during the show can do so by signing up at the registration desk in the main building.
